What do I do with my old garbage pails or bins?

Ultimately you own your current bins or containers, so you are free to keep them or do as you please. They **CANNOT** be used once your carts are delivered to your house moving forward as our truck will only collect carts that we have provided for you to use. We are offering a recycling option to all residents to be conducted on January 19th, 2022. On this day please put out all old plastic bins, lids, carts **COMPLETELY EMPTY**. We will collect these and recycle them instead of landfilling.

Garbage Carts: The 65-gallon cart is used for garbage. All garbage must be inside this cart.

- It is best to have garbage inside the can in tied plastic bags
- Garbage should be drained of all liquids, especially used cooking oils.
- It is required all garbage fits inside the cart for collection. Even on a full week, it is preferred the lid is opened or cracked open instead of having loose bags around or on top of the container.
- Items not fitting into the cart will require a bulk pick up (Please see section below to learn how to schedule: **How do I schedule a Bulk Waste or White Goods Collection?**)
- **DO NOT PLACE IN CARTS: DIRT, SOD, ROCKS, CONCRETE, CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS, FLAMMABLE MATERIALS (SUCH AS OIL, GAS, PAINT OR HOT COALS OR ASHES), AND MURATIC ACID AND OTHER POOL SUPPLIES/CHEMICALS.**

Yard Waste Carts:

Place yard waste in provided 95-gallon carts. As with the garbage container, yard waste needs to be placed inside the cart for automated collection. We can collect material that is inside the cart even if the lid is cracked open. We prefer you break down and trim weekly material to fit inside the cart loosely. Attempting to compact and stuff the cart may not empty all the way on weekly collection. You are provided year-round weekly collection of yard waste, if you do not have yard waste on a specific week there is no need to place the container at the curb for collection. We strongly encourage reducing the use of plastic bags for accumulating yard trash as it cannot be mixed in with this type of waste. We would suggest using biodegradable bags for yard waste to gather leaves. Do not put loose leaves in the bin as those items can blow all over when being dumped and cause a mess.

Tips for once-a-week garbage pickup:

- If you have a garbage disposal, use to eliminate food scraps and liquids.
- Recycle as much as possible.
- Avoid the use of plastics
- Use reusable containers/glassware
- Learn to repair rather than discard
- Donate used items to friends, family, or local thrift shop or Goodwill.
- Reduce throwaway glass bottles and containers.
- Bag or double bag all waste during summer months when heat produces higher levels of smells and insects
- Store containers in the shade during the week between collection days
- Keep the lids closed
- Consider washing your container out periodically. Pouring a capful of nonhazardous household cleaners will assist in odor control.

What time do I need to have my garbage and yard waste containers curbside?

We ask all waste to be curbside either the night before your service day, or no later than 7:00am on your collection day.

What happens if my normally scheduled service day falls on a holiday or is interrupted by a Hurricane?

Florida Express Environmental only observes the following Holidays every year: Thanksgiving Day; Christmas Day; New Year's Day; Memorial Day; July 4th; & Labor Day. If your service day falls on or after a holiday, please visit our website www.floridaexpress.us and look at the very top where it says Holiday Schedule. Click on Holiday Schedule and find the holiday in question and the alternate schedule for that week. In case of a hurricane it's important to follow our social media accounts for fast word of changes in schedules. We do try to update our website as well, but it is not always easily done under circumstances or evacuation orders.

How do I schedule a Bulk Waste Collection?

You must contact Florida Express directly to create a service ticket for our collection team. Please call 352-369-5411, Monday-Friday between 8am and 5pm. A Florida Express Environmental Customer Service Representative will answer the phone call. Should the item you need collected require any additional cost we will make you aware at time of scheduling and collect payment. Orders must be placed by 2pm on Tuesday prior to your receiving collection of Bulk Items on the next occurring Wednesday.

Once scheduling is confirmed, your item(s) will need to be curbside the next occurring pickup date by 7:00am. We will then have it collected by end of day.

WE WILL NOT COLLECT BULK WASTE UNLESS YOU FOLLOW THE ORDER PROCESS ABOVE.

Will Florida Express Environmental remove hazardous waste?

No. We do not collect any oils, gas, paint, thinners, fertilizers, insecticides, NiCad batteries, fluorescent bulbs, anything containing mercury, chlorine, acid (even empty containers), any chemical or explosive material and television sets. Please contact the Marion County Solid Waste department located at 5601 SE 66th St in Ocala, FL or call (352) 671-8465 to find out what disposal options may be available to you.
